
Srinidhi Sekar & Hariharan Natarajan: Internships with Equitas

Rekha Vijaykumar – is a 22-year young woman, who joined KLC when she was 10. She worked hard with her teachers in improving her skills, working on her emotional difficulties, showing interest in all activities of the class, becoming confident, taking care of her peers, leading, and helping them and the teachers. As she grew up, she excelled in all the vocational skills, be it cooking, stitching, candle making, carpentry, and worked responsibly and with precision in everything that she did.





Akshaya Saravanan, a 29-year young woman, joined YES in 2018. She was diagnosed with intellectual disabilities. Despite academic challenges, Akshaya finished school until Class X. At YES, she was trained in several aspects of Printing and Documentation and in Culinary Skills. She exhibited a great willingness to learn and was able to follow instructions easily.

Akshaya interned at Writer's Cafe for 6 months and was absorbed as a full-time employee upon completion of her internship.

The annual townhall meeting was held on 22 April and it was, a day of camaraderie, reflection, interaction, exchange of ideas, and the sharing of best practices. The day was structured with an agenda of fun, learning, food, bonding with creativity and presentation from each center. The theme was "Beyond Barriers" and every activity was planned keeping the theme in mind. The day included presentations, sighs, applause, wonder, laughter and pride in everything the organization does.



On April 20, the **Third Annual Day of V-Excel, Nashik**, began with the Marathi prayer 'Heech Amchi Prarthana,' followed by guest introductions and the traditional lighting of the lamp along with the inauguration of UDIT Rehabilitation foundation symbolizing a new era of hope and empowerment. The Ramleela performance by the students showcased various scenes, including the formation of the Ayodhya temple, Sita Swayamvar, 'Sita Haran' by Ravan, Hanuman Chalisa dance, and a depiction of the war between Ravan and Ram's forces.

The grand finale saw all students unite in a jubilant dance, echoing 'Bharat ka Baccha Baccha Jai Sri Ram Bolega.'



In a significant initiative to support children with special needs, Sri Ramanasramam partnered with V-Excel Educational Trust to launch the **Bhagavan** Ramana Center for Specially-Abled Children (BRC-SAC) in Tiruvannamalai on May 6th, 2024. This collaborative effort provides free special education and therapeutic rehabilitation services, encompassing early intervention for children aged 0 to 8, remedial education for those aged 3 to 14, along with lunch and transportation for children from lower socio-economic backgrounds.



Equitas graciously invited YES to participate in their Summer Sale on May 11, 2024, held at their location. The YES product stall welcomed esteemed visitors including Mr. John Alex, CSR Head, ED & CEO of Equitas Holding Ltd, and Dr. G.N. In May, seven volunteers from the **Grundfos Global Graduates** program visited V-Excel's
Vocational Training Unit. After meeting the
trainees, they joined small groups to learn
beadwork, quilling, jute braiding, tailoring, block
printing, and document scanning—skills taught
by the trainees themselves. The volunteers also
engaged in therapeutic games that supported
coordination, focus, and attention. The
experience fostered meaningful interaction,
mutual learning, and a shared sense of joy.

As part of Hexaware's CSR Employee Engagement program, a team of 12 enthusiastic volunteers and their families visited YES in May. The visit commenced with an orientation session focused on understanding special needs and adults with special needs. The volunteers brought thoughtful gifts of games and fruits for the trainees and actively engaged with them for around four hours through shared activities like conversation, singing, dancing, group art, and indoor games. The positive interactions continued during lunch with the YES team, where the volunteers shared their enriching experiences with the trainees.





On July 9, V-Excel Pandharpur celebrated its first anniversary. Guests of Honor included Smt. Rashmi Kaulware, President of the Inner Wheel Club District 311 and Headmistress of the Yashkirti Vidyalaya, Smt. Geeta Utpat and other Inner Wheel Club members. All the children were involved in the celebrations. The Inner Wheel club members donated sensory materials to the center.

& CEO of Sringeri Math visited V-Excel in July. He came to V-Excel's head office, Sharada, took a walk-through of the entire building. He peeped into every room and spent time understanding the scope of the work that was being done.



Despite being divided into teams (blue, yellow, black, and white), the V-Excel team experienced favorable weather as the usual Chennai heat gave way to overcast skies for their "V-Excel Premier League (VPL)". The energetic cricket match was played with enthusiasm. The meticulously planned event fostered a competitive yet spirited atmosphere among colleagues, reminiscent of a major tournament, filled with moments of quiet strategy and joyful celebration.





On August 2nd, 2024, V-Excel Educational Trust achieved a significant step towards its goal of expanding its reach to Tier 2 and Tier 3 towns with the inauguration of its 22nd center in Kolapakkam. This milestone was made possible through the initiative of RASEE Charitable Trust, with the support of Super Auto Forge, to provide free rehabilitation services to children with special needs in neighboring villages.

On August 10, 2024, **Disha, the parent forum** of V-Excel Educational Trust, was reinitiated at The Mylapore Club in Mylapore, with 30 parents in attendance. Following an invocation and the lighting of the traditional lamp, Ms. Charumathi Sriram, Coordinator of the Vocational Training Unit (VTU), welcomed the gathering and emphasized the significance of such support groups. Inspiring speeches were then delivered by Dr. Vasudha Prakash, Founder-Director of V-Excel Educational Trust, and the guest speaker, Ms. Radha Ramesh, Proprietor of Twin Twigs.



V-Excel, in partnership with Sundaram Educational Trust, continues its thirteen-year tradition of presenting "A Class Apart" to mainstream schools in Chennai. This year-long professional development program, conducted over three threeday sessions, addresses the diverse learning challenges faced by neurodivergent individuals. Beyond skill development, the program aims to transform educators' perspectives, fostering an internal framework to navigate the daily complexities of inclusive classrooms. The first module of this year's program engaged 37 teachers from 22 schools in dynamic activities involving movement, painting, singing, listening, and speaking. Through these experiences, the teachers learned that learning is inclusive and leaves no child behind in the classroom.







V-Excel Nashik has received a **Certificate as a DISHA Implementing School**. The DISHA

program, an initiative of the Ministry of Social

Justice and Empowerment, centers on early
intervention and ensuring school readiness for
children with developmental disabilities. This
certification recognizes V-Excel Nashik's
commitment to empowering students with
special needs to reach their full potential.

Sangam '24, the sports meet hosted by V-Excel Educational Trust, was a significant success. Held at St. Bede's playground in Santhome, Chennai, over two days on August 22nd and 23rd, the event was the culmination of months of planning, including invitations to other institutions serving special children/adults and the organization of preliminary rounds at their respective premises. A total of 352 children and adults from seven special schools, including V-Excel, participated, with 160 participants engaging in activities on the first day. The efforts of each participant were acknowledged with a Certificate of Appreciation.

During the District Differently Abled Welfare Officer's inspection at OutReach, Pollachi, the accessibility and support systems for special students were noted as largely adequate, with specific mention of ramps, specialized teaching aids, and the use of individualized education plans. The officer identified areas for improvement, suggesting additional staff training and more inclusive classroom materials. The inspection concluded with recommendations aimed at enhancing overall inclusivity and ensuring adherence to accessibility standards. As a token of appreciation, the officer received a memento featuring vocational training products crafted by the school's special young adults.





OutReach, Pollachi celebrated its 8th anniversary on September 17. Reflecting on this milestone, Mr. Bala (Board Member) and Dr. Manju (Managing Trustee) expressed their gratitude to Dr. Vasudha Prakash, the guiding force of V-Excel, whose influence has drawn individuals like them to the organization since 2017. Today, the Outreach team remembers all direct and indirect patrons of V-Excel who have placed their trust in them and offered invaluable support during challenging times.

On a visit to the Youth Empowerment Center of V-Excel, Nashik, Shri Bhausaheb Mhasu Narwade, an expert with 27 years of experience at Dr. Devendra Ohra Residential Matimand Vidyalaya in Sangamner, conducted a **seminar on Legal Guardianship** for parents of adults with special needs. The session, attended by all teaching and non-teaching staff and most of the parents, provided valuable insights into the legal aspects of securing the future of individuals with special needs. Shri Narwade interacted informally with the parents, sharing real-life experiences and explaining relevant legal clauses and the benefits of legal guardianship. The information he provided offered both teachers and parents a new perspective on this crucial aspect of planning for the wellbeing of their adult children with special needs.

A standout moment in October was **TATTVA 2024**, an inclusive art exhibition curated by V-Excel's Youth Empowerment Services (YES) team. Held at Alliance Française on October 26, the event featured 178 artworks by 128 special artists from 11 special schools and three V-Excel centers.

With a professional gallery setup, corporate volunteer support, and select pieces auctioned, the exhibition blended creativity with community engagement. The result: 160 artworks sold, and a powerful celebration of talent, inclusion, and expression.





On Vijayadasami, October 12, 2024, V-Excel Educational Trust, in collaboration with Super Auto Forge, inaugurated a **new early intervention center at Unamancheri**, located on the Kolapakkam highway. This center provides services free of charge to children with special needs. The opening ceremony included a prayer, followed by consultations and assessments for children. Those children who were assessed and deemed eligible for interventions were invited to begin their therapy sessions the following week.

On October 16, 2024, a **mental health awareness session** was conducted for all teaching and administrative staff in Nashik by the school counselor, Smt. Pradnya Apte. The session centered on the well-being of teachers, highlighting the importance of identifying and managing their own stress levels. Teachers received guidance on strategies for maintaining mental health, reducing stress, and enhancing their overall well-being, with a strong emphasis on the necessity of self-care in their demanding professions.

On November 5, His Holiness Jagadguru Sri Vidhushekhara Bharati Sannidhanam, **the revered pontiff of the Sri Sringeri Sharada Peetham, graced V-Excel**. Prof. Anand Jagadeesan, Chief Functionary, V-Excel warmly welcomed His Holiness and expressed gratitude for his blessings.



During His Holiness' visit, the atmosphere was imbued with a sense of spiritual upliftment. The Jagadguru interacted with the children, showering them with blessings and words of encouragement. The Jagadguru's visit has further strengthened V-Excel's resolve to continue its noble mission. The institution remains steadfast in its commitment to creating a more inclusive society, where every child, regardless of their abilities, has the opportunity to reach their full potential.



V-Excel conducted a 5-day in-house training program for select participants from its satellite centres in Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu. The workshop was designed to equip the members to understand the philosophy and background of curative education and get a practical insight into rhythmic movements, hand work sessions, circle time and finger rhymes, main lesson stories and vocational activities done in Chennai.

"Chandramouli: A Real-life Story of an Adult with Special Needs," a CBFC-certified short documentary film by V-Excel Educational Trust, premiered at PVR Sathyam Cinemas in Royapettah, Chennai, on November 16, 2024. The film chronicles the transformative journey of Chandramouli Ramadoss, a young man with special needs, highlighting his remarkable achievements through unwavering support and personalized care at V-Excel. The film's primary goal was to foster public awareness regarding neurodivergent diversity and promote inclusion within mainstream society.



On November 29th, Charu Sriram, the Vocational Coordinator from VTU was invited to speak at the **Regional Parents Meet Conference** organized by NIEPMD in collaboration with Parivaar – National Confederation of Parents Organizations, South Zone. She addressed the parents regarding opportunities in open employment. The Meet was a gathering for parents to connect, share experiences, and learn about resources and support available for their children with multiple disabilities.

On November 10th, six trainees from YES, accompanied by one trainer participated in the inclusive Sargam choir performance held at Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan in Mylapore. The event commemorated the birth centenary of the late Sri M.B. Srinivasan and also marked the 15th anniversary of the Sargam Choir, led by Dr. Sudha Raja. The chief guest for the occasion was retired Judge Smt. Prabha Sridevan.



On December 5, 2024, **Bala Vidya Mandir (BVM), Adyar welcomed V-Excel students** for a vibrant afternoon of sports, music, and dance under clear blue skies. The warmth of BVM students—expressed through cards, gifts, and heartfelt messages—created an atmosphere of pure joy and acceptance.

On December 8, 2024, eight trainees from V-Excel's Youth Empowerment Services (YES), accompanied by Skill Trainer Divya Venkatesh and Center Coordinator Gayathri Suryanarayanan, proudly participated in the **Star Book of World Records Silambam Marathon** held at YMCA, Nandanam.

In a remarkable display of stamina and discipline, the group walked 5 kilometers while continuously performing Silambam routines. Their commitment and energy stood out, earning them a special moment on the dais where they were applauded for their enthusiasm, perseverance, and spirited participation.

In the customary **spirit of Christmas**, V-Excel's Blue Blue Sky Choir delighted an audience of students from Grades 1 to 4 at the Tattva School, Chennai. The children enthusiastically sang along and interacted with Santa and the teachers joined in the dancing.





December 3rd marks World Disability Day, a time to honor inclusion, empowerment, and the diverse abilities within our communities. To commemorate this, V-Excel Educational Trust hosted its annual **December Bazaar**, transforming its premises into a vibrant hub of creativity and connection.

The event showcased handcrafted products made by trainees from across V-Excel's units, reflecting skill, effort, and pride. A standout feature was the "Games Cart" by the Early Intervention unit, offering therapeutic games designed for fun and engagement. Open to all, the space echoed with laughter as children and adults alike immersed themselves in play.



On December 20, V-Excel Pandharpur organized a lively Bazaar Day for the children of the center. The event was honored by the presence of the chief guest, Mrs. Shailaja Anil Savant. Volunteers from the Visionar's Group of D.H. Kavathekar Prashala, Pandharpur, collaborated with the V-Excel Pandharpur team to support the event.

Parents played an active role in assisting their children with preparations, while the student volunteers worked alongside the children, promoting inclusion. Together, they strategized on effective sales techniques for the children's products. Local community members were invited to attend Bazaar Day to offer encouragement, interact with the children, and support their efforts through purchases.

V-Excel Erode initiated a tuck shop within the school, operating every Thursday. The prevocational students prepare fresh and healthy snacks, along with other products such as turmeric powder, paper bags, and colored diyas. With the assistance of trainees, the students are now able to measure and pack the items themselves. This initiative has been successfully implemented and has received positive feedback from parents.



In December 2024, seven trainees and two trainers from the Youth Empowerment Services (YES) unit were part of the **inclusive choir group**, **'Sargam'**, and performed at several events across different venues in Chennai. On December 6th, they performed at the inaugural function of Margazhimatram, in Mylapore.



On December 10th, the choir performed at Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan in Mylapore, then on December 13th at the Sankara Vidyashram Auditorium in Thiruvanmiyur and their final performance for the month was on December 28th at Sri Hariharan Hall in Adyar. Throughout these programs, the YES choir group collaborated with the members of the Sargam Choir, led by Dr. Sudha Raja, to perform a repertoire of devotional, Carnatic, and patriotic songs.



At a two-day conference held at IIT Madras in January, V-Excel's team of special educators, led by Associate Director Gita Bhalla, along with Neha Bharadwaj and Puja Bhalla, conducted a **three-hour participatory workshop** on "**Inclusion in the Early Years.**" This workshop was part of a series of upskilling sessions and seminars featuring experts from the Indian Association for Child and Adolescent Mental Health (IACAM) and the education industry. The series aimed to share knowledge on researched alternative teaching methods, classroom inclusivity, and related themes.

On January 5th, a panel comprising of child psychologists, educators, researchers, and policymakers was convened to discuss and share insights on addressing often overlooked challenges and potential solutions within the education sector, among other pertinent topics. Ms. Lavanya Ashok, the Early Intervention Coordinator for VExcel in Chennai, was a member of this panel.







At #COSTAA2025 held at the IIT Madras Research Park in Chennai on January 8, 2025, Dr. Sudha Raja of Sargam Choir delivered an inspiring lecture demonstration on "Choir Pedagogy and Accessibility." During her session, she highlighted the therapeutic benefits of music and shared her experiences in training individuals with special needs. Ms. Gayathri Suryanarayanan of V-Excel Educational Trust also contributed by sharing the inspiring journeys of trainees within the inclusive choir.

On January 18, 2025, V-Excel Educational Trust hosted an insightful **Disha parent forum**meeting at Sharada, their Head Office in R.A. Puram, Chennai. The forum, themed "The Next
Chapter – Transition Planning for Success," brought together 70 participants, including parents
and members of the V-Excel team. The session was expertly led by Ms. Gayathri
Suryanarayanan, the Center Coordinator of V-Excel's Mylapore center. During the meeting,
parents openly shared their personal experiences, the challenges they face, and the specific
areas where they require support. The attendees included parents of trainees who have already
secured employment and those whose children have opted for either exclusive or inclusive
community living arrangements. Heartfelt stories and effective strategies for navigating
challenges were shared, providing valuable insights for all present. Dr. Vasudha Prakash, Mrs.
Usha Rajagopal, and Mrs. Jayadevi Jayaprakash, also addressed the gathering. They shared
their suggestions and recommendations regarding crucial aspects of transition planning.




Dr. Vasudha Prakash was appointed to the Tamil Nadu Government's Committee for Research on Disability. This appointment marks a significant step forward in the pursuit of a more inclusive society within the state.

Trainees from the Vocational Training Centre in Nashik participated in a **road safety awareness session** at the Traffic Education Park. Miss Shilpa, a senior trainer, led an engaging PowerPoint presentation, explaining crucial safety measures such as the importance of wearing helmets and seat belts, and the dangers of using mobile phones while driving. The trainees actively explored the park's traffic signals, road signs, and pedestrian crossings, providing them with practical, hands-on learning. The session further reinforced key safety concepts through the use of informative videos and real-life demonstrations highlighting the significance of zebra crossings, footpaths, and subways.

Oviya Sangamam, a vibrant art exhibition, was held at Semmozhi Poonga, Chennai, on February 2, 2025. Organized by the Indian Art Factory, this special event showcased the remarkable talents of young artists from five institutions, including YES (Youth Empowerment Services) from V-Excel Educational Trust and other special schools. Seventy-seven organizations participated. This included 74 NGOs and 3 corporates and a total of 169 participants.

The puja was graced by the presence of esteemed donors, Mrs. Uma and Mr. Suryanarayan. Honoring the occasion were V-Excel Committee Members Mr. Jayant Bhatambrekar, Mr. Krishnakumar Rao, and Mr. Jagdish Gilda, alongside the guiding force behind V-Excel, Founder Director Dr. Vasudha Prakash. A group of 35 students and staff from YES, Chennai, recently experienced the "Local '24" Art and Design exhibition at the Lalit Kala Akademi.

Curated by Ms. Aishwarya Manivannan of Maisha Studio, the exhibition featured artworks by 16 of her students, centered around themes of connection and interactive learning.



The exhibition presented a diverse collection of around 100 pieces spanning fine art, painting, drawing, installations, sculptures, film, photography, fashion, and product design, all created by 16 talented individuals aged 16 to 23. Maisha Studio generously sponsored the transportation and refreshments for the YES visitors, who each received an artwork bookmark as a memento of their visit.



On July 11th, a group of 25 trainees and 13 trainers from YES visited **Kanchipuram**. Their trip included a visit to the Ayyampettai Weaver's Cooperative Society, where they observed traditional silk and cotton weaving. The group then proceeded to the Manimandapam of Jagadguru Shri Chandrasekharendra Saraswati Mahaswamigal at Orikkai.

At the temple and gurukulam, the YES team distributed small bags of notebooks and stationery, to the gurukulam students. In return, the gurukulam students chanted mantras, including the Dhanvantri Slokam, for the wellbeing of the YES trainees. The YES team had lunch at the Orikkai temple's Bhojanaalayam. The highlight of the visit was an audience with the Kanchi Mutt Peetathipathi Sri Vijayendra Saraswati Swamigal, who showed great interest in the organization and blessed the group.

The vocational students at KLC explored the inspirational story of Joan of Arc through a **trip to Pondicherry**. Carefully planned to encourage listening, observation, drawing, and real-world engagement beyond the school environment, the students visited the garden and Notre Dame Church, where Joan's statue stands.



Their day involved navigating traffic, managing hunger, practicing independence at hotels, observing silence at church, enjoying the beach freely, showing reverence at an artists' village, and encountering diverse people, sounds, sights, challenges, and joys.



On July 20th, a group of 14 students and 12 staff from V-Excel Erode visited the **Mettur Dam** to expose students to real-life situations, fostering critical thinking, social and communication skills, teamwork, and community building. Their visit included a jaggery production unit where staff explained the making process. At the Mettur Dam, they experienced pleasant weather, viewed the dam from the viewpoint and higher levels, and observed the significant water flow due to rains. The group enjoyed packed food and snacks, visited a park where the children played, and explored the aquarium within the park.

The group visited both the Sankara Mutt and the adjacent Panchamukeshwarar Tripurasundari Amman Temple. During the visit, the trainees received bags, notebooks, sketch pens, and prasadam. The trainees reportedly enjoyed the day and conducted themselves well.



As part of their annual planning process, which includes a trial overnight stay before the main trip during the academic year, VTU Adyar organized a local overnight stay for ten new trainees at their familiar center. This yearly project aims to observe the trainees' Activities of Daily Living (ADLs) and identify any potential challenges to ensure a smooth experience during the annual trip. The trainees stayed overnight at the center on December 6 and on the following morning, they followed their usual routines and continued activities at the center.





The staff from the Early Intervention - Vocational Rehabilitation Center (EI-VRC) embarked on an **experiential trip to Trivandrum**, where they visited the Different Art Centre, an initiative by the renowned magician, Mr. Gopinath Muthukad.

This center focuses on educating and empowering children with various disabilities, broadening the scope of training beyond magic to encompass art forms such as music, dance, drama, cinema making, painting, and skills in diverse musical instruments. The Different Art Centre has nurtured the talents of approximately 200 differently-abled children, showcasing their abilities to the wider world. The visit provided a wonderful and insightful day for the EI-VRC team to experience the center's impactful work firsthand.

From February 5th to 8th, 2025, the trainees and staff of the Vocational Training Unit (VTU) Adyar enjoyed a memorable **outstation trip to Ooty**, filled with learning, laughter, and connection. Their itinerary included visits to the vibrant Botanical Gardens, where they appreciated the beautiful color combinations of the flora, and the serene Ooty Lake, where they experienced the joy of boating. They also enjoyed walking across a hanging bridge, exploring Doddabetta Peak, and watching the captivating musical fountains.

Visits to local chocolate, tea, and varki (crispy vegetarian snack)-making factories provided interesting insights into these processes, while the intricate beauty of the Thread Garden left everyone in admiration. A highlight of the trip was the magical Ooty Mountain Train ride, which took them through tunnels and picturesque valleys.

Beyond the sightseeing, the trip fostered a sense of connection, as everyone embraced nature and enjoyed each other's company, reinforcing their sense of belonging. A particularly serene experience was their visit to Isha Yoga & Adi Yogi, where the trainees seamlessly integrated into the peaceful and meditative atmosphere.







The YES team embarked on their **annual outstation trip** for 2025, flying **to Visakhapatnam** (Vizag). A group of thirty-four individuals, comprising 21 trainees and 13 staff members, traveled on an IndiGo flight to Vizag on February 17, 2025, and stayed at the Landmark Hotel. Over their three-day stay, they explored various attractions, including Kailasagiri, the Simhachalam temple, Rushikonda Beach, RK Beach, VMRDA Park, the Sea Harrier Museum, the Tupolev Aircraft Museum, and the INS Kursura Submarine Museum. They also took a scenic long drive to Lambasinghi, the nearest hill station, where they enjoyed a relaxed visit to a strawberry farm, a flower garden, and picturesque viewpoints.


